In the 2015 QS ranking of the best universities by discipline, Sciences Po ranked fifth worldwide for political science and international relations.

STUDY

Sciences Po offers programmes from Bachelor's to Doctorate level, organised into three main stages:

- > **Undergraduate College:** a three-year Bachelor's programme. The first two years take place on one of the seven campuses in Paris and other regions. The third year is completed abroad.
- > **Schools and Master's programmes:** open to students with a three-year undergraduate degree, Master's study takes place in one of the seven schools or in a Master's programme on the Paris campus.
- > **Doctorates:** students wishing to pursue a PhD after their Master's degree can enter one of the five doctoral programmes on the Paris campus.

Sciences Po Executive Education also offers 17 executive Master's programmes for professionals and managers, among other continuing education offerings.

SCIENCES PO'S SCHOOLS & MASTER'S DEGREES

- The Urban School (2015).

RESEARCH

Research is central to Sciences Po's intellectual approach and reputation. Our research mission is twofold: to contribute to the analysis and understanding of the contemporary world and to enrich the content of our teaching programmes.

The work of Sciences Po's research centres is recognized worldwide and contributes to the university's international reputation. Research at Sciences Po covers a wide variety of themes (risk, democracy, urban development, digital technology, globalisation, public health, etc.) and all geographic areas. Publications resulting from this work have secured Sciences Po a good position in the global rankings, including fifth place for political science and international relations in 2015.

Sciences Po research centres, seven of which are associated with the CNRS, produce new approaches and knowledge in law, economics, history, political science and sociology.

INTERNATIONAL

Today, Sciences Po ranks among the world's top universities. Half of our student body is recruited internationally, forming an intercultural community that represents some 150 nationalities.

Sciences Po maintains a unique network of partner universities, including University of California, Berkeley (USA), University of Cambridge (England), Freie Universität Berlin (Germany), Fudan University (China), Keio University (Japan), MGIMO (Russia), University of British Columbia (Canada), University of Ghana (Ghana), University of São Paulo (Brazil), and many more.

Within this network, Sciences Po has developed 34 dual degree programmes with prestigious universities such as Columbia University (New York, USA), the London School of Economics (UK) and Peking University (Beijing, China). The network also gives rise to cooperation of the highest standard in both teaching and research, as illustrated by the Alliance programme, the Global Public Policy Network, Oxpo with Oxford (UK) and Maxpo with the Max Planck Institute (Germany).

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Sciences Po allocates an annual budget of 10.2 million euro to scholarships and financial aid.



Sciences Po has always been anxious to serve the public interest. Social responsibility is a central concern in all our activities, from student recruitment, teaching and research to university governance.

The proportion of scholarship recipients among the Sciences Po student body has quadrupled over the past ten years, reaching almost 30 percent. This is the combined result of a proactive policy for need-based financial aid and of the Equal Opportunity and Diversity Programme. This specific admissions scheme, established in 2001, remains one of a kind among equal opportunities programmes in higher education. The scheme concerns 106 high schools


throughout France, and has facilitated admission of 1,300 students since it began.

Sciences Po is also committed to the inclusion of students, faculty and staff with disabilities through the Sciences Po Accessible programme, and to effectively promoting gender equality in all sections of the university community.

SCIENCES PO'S RESOURCES

State funding now accounts for less than half of Sciences Po's budget.

It represented 44 percent of the university's resources in 2015, compared to 66 percent in 2000.
