Olivier Rozenberg, Associate Professor at Sciences Po (CEE), presents the 7th Conference of the ECPR Standing Group on Parliaments which is hosted by the Centre for European Studies and Comparative Politics (Sciences Po) from June 30 to July 2 2022.

Question: What is the ECPR?

The ECPR Is A network of european political scientists organizing mostly conferences around Europe and made of standing groups focused on a given issue.

Question 2: Can you present the 7th conference of the ECPR?

The conference will be organized around thematic panels, some deal with parliamentary oversight, some deal with voting within the Parliament, some deal with institutional designs and evolutions of institutional rules.

So, there are differences in topics and methods.

Of course, we put special emphasis on young scholars, PhD students, postdoctoral researchers in order to help them to be a member of the Academic European community specializing in Parliaments.

Question 3: Can you present your involvement in the 7th Conference of the ECPR Standing Group on Parliaments?

Within the Standing Groups of the ECPR, there is one that deals with Parliaments which is very classic of political science.

Indeed, the Standing Group on Parliaments organizes a conference every two years dealing with all aspects of legislative and parliamentary activities, institutions and behavior. That's what we will do in Sciences Po in early July of 2022, with about 80 participants from all over the world and especially Europe presenting papers.

Question 4: What about France?

France has been very late embedded within these kinds of International networks. So, very pleased that today this can be organized here in Paris, and we've lot of release from France and all the colleagues who are working on the same subject on theoretical or empirical perspective.
