Application to the host university

- Please do not contact your host university directly until you are asked to do so. You will receive the appropriate communication in due course
- ➤ All questions concerning your application process should be addressed to **Sophie ECLAPPIER** at the APAMO Centre
- > Observe the deadlines set out by the APAMO Centre

Visa application

- You are responsible for the visa procedure
- Make sure your passport is valid:
 - For the length of your stay in Australia
 - Until 3 months after your expected date of return from New Zealand
 - You normally can apply for a VISA from your country of residence and/or origin
- Wait until you get officially accepted in the host university to start the student visa procedure:
 - Going to Australia: wait for the Electronic Certificate of Enrolment, then purchase your visa on www.border.gov.au
 - Going to New Zealand: wait for the Offer of Place
- Visa costs:
 - Australia: AUD620 → 384€ (SUBCLASS 500 Student Visa)
 - New Zealand: NZD270 → 200€
- A student visa allows you to work up to 20 hours a week in Australia and New Zealand

Flight tickets

- Please do NOT buy your flight tickets before you get officially accepted by the host university
- We recommend that you arrive 7 days before the starting date of your first semester abroad (depending on the dates granted by your visa)
- Should you by a flight ticket much in advance of your classes, you may not be able to enter the country as VISAS are normally granted for a start corresponding to the start of classes

Academic requirements

REGISTER FOR AND VALIDATE THE EQUIVALENT OF AT LEAST 60 ECTS

Minimum workload per year is calculated in <u>8 courses</u> (4* courses per semester** is the equivalent of 30 ECTS)

II. REGISTER FOR AND VALIDATE THE EQUIVALENT OF 40% OF YOUR COURSES WITHIN YOUR MAJOR. Check the Discipline/Major equivalence online

Major validation per year is calculated in 3 courses *** (1.5 courses per semester)

We strongly recommend you validate most of your Major-related courses during the 1st semester

*UTS has a 24 UTS cp = 30 ECTS structure. Students can take either 4 x 6cp subjects, or 3 x 8cp subjects. Both of these are considered a full time study load worth 24 UTS cp i.e. 30 ECTS. Subjects at the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences and some Law subjects are 8 credit points. NB: Major validation @UTS is still 3 courses per year!

^{**} UNSW has August Term + Term3 + January Term + Term1 (August Term: 1 course + Term3: 3 courses+ January Term: 1 course+ Term1: 3 courses)

^{***2} courses if you are doing a hybrid year

Academic requirements

- III. GEOGRAPHICAL SPECIALISATION: Validate 2 courses related to your area (max. 1 language course)
- IV. COMMUNICATE the definitive list of courses for which you have effectively registered to Anna Dall'Oca no later than 2 weeks after classes start, each semester. (You will also be asked to declare your courses online throughout the year)

Academic requirements

- Submit your **Rapport de séjour** to the International Affairs Division at the end of your 3rd year
- Submit your Grand Ecrit (details will be provided by the Collège Universitaire)
- Throughout your year or semester abroad, communicate **any questions or difficulties to your regional manager** at Sciences Po: Anna Dall'Oca
- Send each semester your transcripts to Student Mobility Division (notes.sejour@sciencespo.fr)

Academic calendar

The academic calendar is reversed in Australia and New-Zealand!

 1^{st} semester $\rightarrow 2^{nd}$ semester 2^{nd} semester $\rightarrow 1^{st}$ semester of the next academic year

In Australia:

- 1st semester: end of July to end of November
- 2nd semester: beginning of March to the end of June
- UNSW: tailored terms starting in August

In New-Zealand:

- 1st semester: mid-July to mid-November
- 2nd semester: end of February to the end of June

Insurance

- Sciences Po provides you with MAIF insurance for repatriation and civil liability (see the conditions online)
- Compulsory insurance for students:
 - Australia: Overseas Student Health Cover to get online before entering the country
 - New-Zealand: proceed through the host university
- Costs for a 12-month coverage:
 - Australia: from AUD 550* → 350€
 - New-Zealand: NZD 590 → 380€

^{*}Different prices may apply if you purchase it directly from the host University or from an independent provider

Tuition fees

You must NOT pay tuition fees to the host university! Tuition fees are paid to your home university (Sciences Po) as per our exchange agreement

Only activity fees may apply in some universities to support student organisations and student activities

Other costs

- Australia and New-Zealand are EXPENSIVE! Plan ahead!
- You are responsible for supporting yourself while on exchange (housing, books, transportation, etc.). Cost of life may apply as follows:
 - In Australia: About 1800€ per month in Sydney and Melbourne, 1400€ in Brisbane, and between 1000€ and 1300 € in other cities
 - In New-Zealand: 1100€ per month
- ➤ **Housing** can be provided by the host university → the partner university will inform you of the availabilities of student housing

Mobility grants

- ➢ If you are a Sciences Po scholarship recipients you shall be able to continue receiving funds throughout your 3rd year
- Apply to Sciences Po's International Mobility Fund
- > CROUS, CRIF (Ile-de-France) or other regions
