In the context of the European Council held on June 28th 2018, three French researchers, Virginie Guiraudon (CNRS/Sciences Po) Hélène Thiollet (CNRS/Sciences Po) and Camille Schmoll (Paris 7/ Institut universitaire de France)launched a call to create a Panel of International Experts on Migration and Asylum (IEPAM or GIEMA in French), following the experience of the IPCC.

The call was signed by more than 600 people all over Europe, and beyond.

The meeting organised on December 10th is the first follow-up event to this initiative.

High level European researchers will discuss how they view the missing link between research and migration policy. This meeting will also give the floor to the room.

The working language of the day is English, except for the second part of the afternoon session where we expect discussions to be held in both French and English.
