



CEE ASSOCIATE RESEARCH FELLOWS' CHARTER

1. The status of associate research fellow can be granted to researchers and/or professors from other institutions for a renewable period of three years by decision of the Council (conseil d'unité) of the Centre for European Studies and Comparative Politics (CEE) (UMR8239).

The status of associate researchers for ATER is granted for two years, consistent with their teaching contract.

Applications must be submitted before 1 February in each calendar year for the first session and 1 September for the second. They are addressed to Eleonora Russo, General-Secretary of the CEE (contact.cee@sciencespo.fr), and must include:

- a CV and a full list of publications,
- a research project (about 2 pages) showing the applicant's involvement in the scientific programmes conducted by CEE and referring to past or future collaborations with the Centre's permanent researchers.

The Council examines applications twice a year, in March and October.

With regard to newly qualified PhD holders at CEE, the status of associate research fellow is granted for a nonrenewable period of three years. Requests should be addressed, in writing, within the same timeframe to the Director (Florence Faucher) and the General secretary (Eleonora Russo). The purpose is to maintain an institutional link between the newly qualified PhD holders and the research centre to which they were attached for the preparation of the thesis.

- 2. Associate research fellows take part in the communal life of CEE: they are involved in research projects; they participate in scientific events and can organise such events; they attend the Annual General Assembly of and may be consulted about its institutional and scientific plans.
- 3. The status of associate research fellow confers the following rights:
 - to take part in CEE's scientific activities,
 - to request access to Sciences Po's premisses
 - to request from time to time access to a shared workspace at CEE for occasional purpose,
 - to request a Sciences Po library card,
 - to have a personal page on CEE's website (with links to their own institutional page),
 - to receive administrative support in pursuing research projects (under the conditions set out in the specific rules of calls for proposals, and with the agreement of CEE's Director).
- 4. Associate research fellows are required to follow a scientific signature charter.

The use of the Sciences Po, CEE logo or name is restricted to publications that present research results obtained within the framework of activities linked with the project presented with the fellowship application. By contrast, its use is forbidden for opinion pieces or media contributions.

5. Associate research fellows might be contacted during the period of association about the progress of their research activities conducted in conjunction with CEE.
