CALL FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST FOR

The design of the COST Action CA16111 Logo

Deadline for applications:
2 March 2018

As part of COST Action CA16111 "International Ethnic and Immigrant Minorities' Survey Data Network" (ETHMIGSURVEYDATA), the Grant Holder of this Action ([Sciences Po, CEE](#)) invites submissions of expressions of interest from graphic artists to create a logo for the Cost Action CA16111.

Terms and Conditions

1. The objective of the present call for expressions of interest is the design of a logo for the [COST Action CA16111 ETHMIGSURVEYDATA](#).
2. The call is open to graphic artists of any nationality based in a [COST country](#).
3. The selected candidate is expected to deliver **3 variants of the logo proposal by 25 March 2018**.
4. The delivered work must be original, and a clear statement confirming its originality will need to be provided along.
5. All techniques are accepted as long as the logos are delivered as high-resolution images.
6. Budget cannot exceed EUR 800.
7. The selected logo will be used as the image of the COST Action CA16111 on the Action website, programmes of activities, leaflets, and publications in general. Under no circumstances the selected logo will be used for commercial purposes.
8. The applicant agrees to, if selected, give up sole rights to his or her submission. The use rights of the 3 variants of the logo will be transferred to the Grant Holder indefinitely. Furthermore, the selected candidate shall agree to any and all changes to the logo design that the Grant Holder deems necessary. The Grant Holder also reserves the right not to use any of the submitted logo ideas.

Applications and selection process

Applications must include the following documents:

1. Professional CV;
2. A sample of previous work (2-3 logos previously designed or equivalent graphic design);
3. Written proposal of 500 words describing the concept and the technique that will be used to create the logos and how these are related to the Cost Action CA16111 goals and identity.
4. Quotation giving the cost for the design of 3 logo variants to be delivered in form of high-resolution image files.

Selection criteria:

1. Professional expertise.
2. Aesthetic adequacy of previous work.
3. Originality of the written proposal.

All applications must be received by mid-night on **2 March 2018** at siresa.lopez@sciencespo.fr with the following subject line: CA16111 LOGO.

The selected candidate will receive a notification email by **9 March 2018**.

The final work and the corresponding invoice should be delivered by **25 March 2018**.

The payment of the invoice will happen within 30 days after the delivery date.

About the COST Action CA16111 ETHMIGSURVEYDATA

ETHMIGSURVEYDATA is an international network set up to bring together researchers, policy makers, and survey data producers to join efforts to improve the access, usability, dissemination and standards of the multiple and scattered survey data that exist on the economic, social and political integration of ethnic and migrant minorities (EMMs).

ETHMIGSURVEYDATA has been funded by COST Action 16111 to provide the mechanisms that will enhance the research capacity in Europe in the field of EMMs' economic, social and political integration, and will allow a solid and evidence-based transfer of knowledge to policymakers and civil society organizations about the key consequences and social processes related to the integration of EMMs in European societies and elsewhere.

There is a growing amount of survey data on EMMs which cover a variable number of territories (cities, regions, countries) across Europe, as well as an increasing number of general purpose surveys (such as labour market surveys or electoral surveys). These include boost samples, separate surveys, or large samples of EMMs. In addition to this, there is a large (but still to be fully documented) number of surveys to EMMs undertaken by various non-for-profit survey or research institutes, civil society organizations, think-tanks and individual scholars.

The results of time-consuming and resource-intensive research efforts are scattered across universities, archives, or in the personal files of individual researchers. Additionally, some of these

surveys cover similar EMM groups and overlap in the survey items included so that post-harmonization efforts are feasible.

Techniques and experience with data harmonization, especially within the data science research community, have improved vastly the quality of harmonized data sets. Thus, in an era when 'big data' is so much in fashion, the time seems ripe to pool resources and efforts on the systematic compilation, archiving, dissemination and analysis of 'smaller data' that can considerably improve our current knowledge of EMMs' incorporation to public life in a cost-effective way.

The network will produce a comprehensive compilation of the data that is available on EMMs' integration across Europe and beyond and will articulate the mechanisms to share the data and make them available to a wider public, academic and non-academic. Ultimately, it will develop ways in which survey data already collected can be subject to a post-harmonization process in order to facilitate comparative analyses of data that currently stand alone and will provide a platform for the coordination of future data collection in this field.

By compiling, documenting, archiving and pooling data coming from various comparable studies conducted around Europe, ETHMIGSURVEYDATA will provide the means to improve the empirical basis of high-quality research. It will also provide a platform for the coordination of future data collection in this field, and coordinate activities to ensure the long-term sustainability of research efforts.
