##### Simon Hix (London School of Economics)

His main areas of research and teaching are comparative democratic institutions, especially voting in parliaments and electoral system design. He has written extensively on the politics of the European Union and the European Parliament. He has recently published (with Bjorn Hoyland) *The Political System of the European Union*, 3rd edition, Palgrave, 2011.
