Jorge Inzulza Contardo is an architect and professor at the Universidad de Chile/ Facultad de Arquitectura y Urbanismo and currently researcher at the Global Urban Research Centre (University of Manchester) where he is carrying a research on 'Regenerating and reconstructing with Latino-gentrification. Towards a sustainable planning framework for intermediate cities at the Global South'. Inzulza Contardo works on gentrification, urban regeneration and planning in a comparative perspective. He recently published 'Latino Gentrification'? Focusing on physical and socioeconomic patterns of change in Latin American inner cities', *Urban Studies*, (49) 10, 2012.
