Cornelia Woll (Sciences Po, CEE & MaxPo)

Cornelia Woll's research focuses on the international political economy and economic sociology, in particular regulatory issues in the European Union and the United States. A specialist on business-government relations, she has recently published *The Power of Inaction: Bank Bailouts in Comparison* (Ithaca, NY: Cornell University Press, 2014), a comparative study on bank bailouts in the United States and Europe and continues to focus on the political responses to the recent financial crisis. Other work has examined economic patriotism, trade and industrial policies, Europeanization and employers' organizations.



Her other recent publications include "Bank Rescue Schemes in Continental Europe: The Power of Collective Inaction" in *Government and Opposition* (Vol. 49, No. 3, 2014, pp. 426-451), *Economic Patriotism in Open Economies*, (with Ben Clift, London: Routledge, 2013) and "Saving the Banks: The Political Economy of Bailouts" in *Comparative Political Studies* (with Emiliano Grossman, Vol. 47, No. 4, 2014, p. 574 - 600).
