2025	Slovenia	Competitiveness of European businesses; green transition; conflicts in Gaza, Lebanon and Syria; Peace Summit in Sharm el-Sheikh.

#### Greece


- Biggest merchant fleet in Europe
- Increasingly pro-active, but facing constraints



### **Conclusions**

- The EU's updated Indo-Pacific Strategy anchored on the new geopolitical reality.
- Most Indo-Pacific states refuse to choose between China and the US
- Mediterranean EU MS have partly, at least grasped the strategic relevance of the Indo-Pacific, but their long-term strategic endurance remains to be seen
- Leading role of France, followed by Italy, Spain and Greece
- Military engagement an effective tool in terms of signalling, but it does not vouch involvement in warfare in case of a contingency
- Mediterranean Europe's engagement with the Indo-Pacific cannot be viewed separately from the overall EU posture

## **Food for Thought**

- All MED-9 countries need coherent and up-to-date China and Indo-Pacific strategies
- The MED-9 agenda would benefit from an Indo-Pacific dimension and could thus contribute in a meaningful way to related EU policies
- Mediterranean Europe could be more ambitious and look at the Indo-Pacific in its entirety, beyond the boundaries of the Western Indian Ocean
- Mediterranean Europe could contribute to a beneficial division of labour between the EU and the US in containing China
- Only three MED-9 countries (France, Italy and Spain) have representative offices in Taiwan - other MED-9 countries could also consider opening offices in Taipei.
