Call for Applications: Tutors for Climate Hackathon

The European Chair for Sustainable Development, hosted by the School of Public Affairs (EAP) and the Paris School of International Affairs (PSIA), is seeking two **Tutors (10-hour contracts each)** to support students participating in the upcoming **Climate Hackathon with the European Investment Bank (EIB)** this autumn, co-organised with the <u>CARE Program</u>.

About the Hackathon

The Climate Hackathon will be a two-part event where approximately 20 master's students will analyse the <u>EIB Climate Survey</u> and complementary public datasets. Working in small groups, students will aim to uncover new insights, identify patterns or correlations, and formulate evidence-based recommendations. Students will be tasked with producing a brief analytical report and a final presentation to be presented at the closing event.

- Hackathon Launch: 3 October 2025 from 5-7:30pm CET
- Final Presentations & Closing Event: 23 October 2025 from 5-7pm CET

Between these two events, teams will work independently with access to tutor support, including via dedicated Zoom sessions.

Each tutor will be responsible for two groups of students (each group comprising approximately 5 students).

Role of the Tutor

The selected tutors will:

- Provide methodological and technical guidance to students as they analyse the EIB Climate Survey and related datasets (e.g., Eurostat).
- Answer student questions and provide targeted support for their reports and presentations during the hackathon launch and one interim online session per group.
- Help students apply quantitative methods appropriately and effectively in their analyses.
- Contribute to creating a positive, collaborative learning environment throughout the hackathon.

Profile Sought

- Advanced knowledge of quantitative research methods (statistics, econometrics, or data science).
- Experience working with **survey data** and large datasets.
- Strong communication skills and ability to explain technical concepts to master-level students.
- Previous teaching or tutoring experience is an asset.
- Familiarity with climate change, sustainability, or public policy topics is desirable.

- **Contract duration:** 10 hours total (including preparation, on-site support at both events, and two online tutoring sessions).
- **Location:** EIB Offices in Paris for the launch event, Sciences Po campus for the final event, Zoom for the interim tutoring sessions.
