

## TEACHING ASSISTANT POSITION

Sciences Po's PSIA, the Paris School of International Affairs is seeking:

A PhD student in 2025-2026, interested in a **teaching assistant position** for the lecture course "The Future of Europe" taught in English by a rotating team of professors, including Arancha GONZALEZ LAYA.

This course is part of the European Studies Concentration at PSIA, as well as [CIVICA - The European University of Social Sciences](#).

### Course description

The graduate course on the 'Future of Europe' is the Europeanship Multi-Campus course, one of the flagship initiatives of CIVICA - the European University of Social Sciences, an alliance of ten leading European higher education institutions in social sciences (Bocconi University (Italy), Central European University (Austria and Hungary), European University Institute (Florence), Hertie School (Germany), IE University (Spain), National University of Political Studies and Public Administration (Romania), Sciences Po (France), SGH Warsaw School of Economics (Poland), Stockholm School of Economics (Sweden), and The London School of Economics and Political Science (United Kingdom)).

The course critically explores four main European policy challenges: Globalization and Economic Shocks; Democracy, Governance, and Populism in the EU; Environment, Sustainability, and the EU Green Deal; and Digitalization and Innovation in the New Europe. It is designed and taught jointly by a team of professors from the different partners of the alliance. The course will be delivered synchronously across all the campuses of the CIVICA consortium as a series of live on-line lectures and roundtables, as well as an additional tutoring session for Sciences Po students. On top of lectures, the course spurs students to work in teams across countries and disciplines, with the aim of completing a final capstone project assignment related to specific and concrete policy challenges. Lectures will start in Fall 2023, together with the capstone project.

### Calendar

This course will meet on Wednesday from 10:15 AM to 12:15 PM, on the Paris campus, in the Fall semester, on the following dates: 10 September, 17 September, 24 September, 1 October, 8 October, 15 October, 17 October\*, 29 October, 5 November, 12 November, 19 November, and 26 November.

\*This session will be held on a Friday, from 4:30 PM to 6:30 PM.

The TA will also be responsible for leading a weekly tutoring session (12 hours over the course of the fall semester), on the following dates: Wednesdays 2:45 to 4:45 PM - 10 September, 24 September, 8 October, 22 October, 12 November and 26 November.

Mid-term exams will be held the week of 23 October.  
Capstone projects will be submitted on 14 December.

## Activities

The Teaching Assistant's assignments support course delivery and may include the following responsibilities:

- Assisting in the preparation of the first module of the course (Two sessions on Globalization and Economic Shocks, taught by Arancha GONZALEZ LAYA and Cornelia WOLL) and bibliographic/pedagogical resources;
- Planning and executing a weekly tutoring session in complement to the lectures;
- Making course materials available to students on the Whaller platform or via other media (email, Google group);
- Following up with students by email: answers to questions (in English and French), bibliographic and methodological advice, reminders of instructions, logistical assistance, etc.;
- Supervising 5 capstone project groups (consultations and grading);
- Coordinating the preparation, proctoring, organization and grading of the various assignments and exams.

Research experiences related to Europe are appreciated. The position requires an excellent level of English (written and oral) and French, work autonomy, social skills and the requisite personal qualities (intellectual curiosity, enthusiasm, punctuality, availability, ability to listen, analytical clarity, rigor, and a sense of responsibility).

## Number of hours and compensation

The contractual number of hours is 36 for the semester, with a remuneration set to 65.10 € per hour (pre-tax).
