Abstract: The history of homosexual life in the late modern period has often been approached through the lens of repression. In this narrative, public institutions and people in same-sex relationships are opposed, against the backdrop of repression and criminalization of sexual offenses. Contra this reading, this thesis argues instead for an embodied history of the regulatory relations and interactions which surrounded the manifestations of homosexual life in Paris over a “short” twentieth century. To this end, it connects the regulatory practices of public institutions (the police and criminal justice

system) with those of ordinary partakers in daily life, such as neighbors, janitors, passers-by and shopkeepers. By connecting police work, urban relations and personal strategies of people who led homosexual lives, this study writes out a new history of homosexualities in the city, showcasing the constraints experienced by the targets of regulatory practices. The study explores the urban space in all its dimensions, from the intimacy of the home to public spaces, social venues, and cruising sites. By examining the geographies of homosexual life, as well as the aspirations and value systems driving its actors, this thesis proposes a social history of a particular regime of normativity based on morality (*bonnes mœurs*) and shows the new ways in which it governed and gripped the sexual and private spheres in the twentieth century.
