

JOB DESCRIPTION

Full-time, Associate/Full professor position beginning on **October 1st 2022**.

The successful candidate will be affiliated to the [Observatoire Sociologique du Changement \(OSC\)](#).

OSC fosters cutting-edge research on social inequality. Research in the center is committed to theory-driven empirical research, drawing on a diversity of methods (qualitative, quantitative, experimental, comparative, etc.), adopting a variety of lenses (micro, meso, macro) and promoting interdisciplinary approaches for an integrated research on inequality in the social sciences. Our research program seeks to measure patterns and trends of inequality, analyze their mechanisms and inform and contribute to policy analysis.

This professorship position is designed to reinforce and complement our expertise in the study of **environmental inequality**. We welcome applications from candidates with an excellent publication record in leading social science journals capable of stimulating new expertise on environmental inequality within Sciences Po. We particularly value candidates with an ambitious **research agenda on global economic and environmental inequality using large-scale worldwide data**. This position is for a senior scholar (Rang A) and only candidates with an *Habilitation* or with a current position at least equivalent to associate professor are eligible.

The successful candidate will fully become a member of the Observatoire sociologique du changement. He/She is expected to play an active role in OSC's collective activity: seminars, academic events, participation in research networks. He/She should also engage in responding to national and international calls to fund research projects. He/She is also supposed to supervise master and PhD students. The selected candidate will also be welcome to participate to [AIRE](#), the Sciences Po Interdisciplinary Research Program on the Environment.

The successful candidate will teach a class on environmental approaches in the social sciences (undergraduate level in one of the 7 campuses) and may also teach on global and environmental inequality (graduate level in the School of Public Affairs or other schools within Sciences Po).

Teaching load:

3 courses with 24 contact hours each per year, 56 hours per year of other academic duties.

Applications are due by **July 10th**. Candidates should have a PhD.

Submissions must include:

- CV with a list of publications
- motivation letter
- Research Statement (2 pages)
- Short Teaching statement (1 page)
- 2 significant publications chosen by the candidate
- The name of two academic referees
