He participated to the research team Trajectories and Origins on migrants and descendants of migrants (under the aegis of the National Statistical Institute in France National demographical Institute).

He is undertaking a comparative research on the consequences of globalization and modernization on personal identity and mores of people newly arriving in cities in India.
