Requirements

- Maximum word length: 900 words (not including references)
- Must be original work
- Use proper citation (APA or Chicago style)
- Language of submission is English
- Send submission as a MS Word document
- Provide a title to your entry
- Entry must be compatible with Sciences Po's values
- If selected for publishing you will need to sign Sciences Po's copyright form

Style tips

- Use short sentences and keep paragraphs short as well
- Use the active tense
- Avoid jargon
- Check your facts and provide source details
- Tone can be conversational (but professional)
- When you quote someone, use parenthesis and identify the source
- Start with an attention-grabbing introduction, and wrap up with a strong conclusion
- You can be as creative as you wish (for example, focus on a particular country or share anecdotes)



Blogging process

- Time permitting, we will provide feedback to a small number of entries
- Sciences Po community will be able to comment on your submission through Whaller (Sciences Po social media tool).
