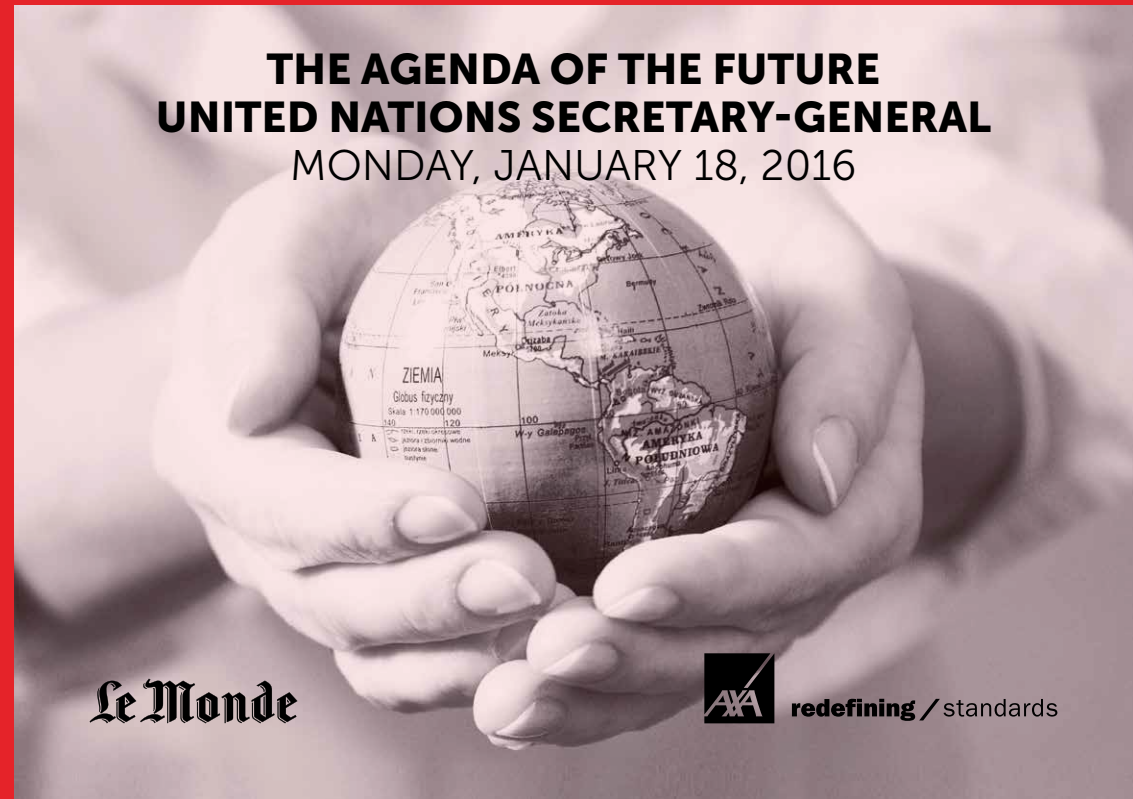

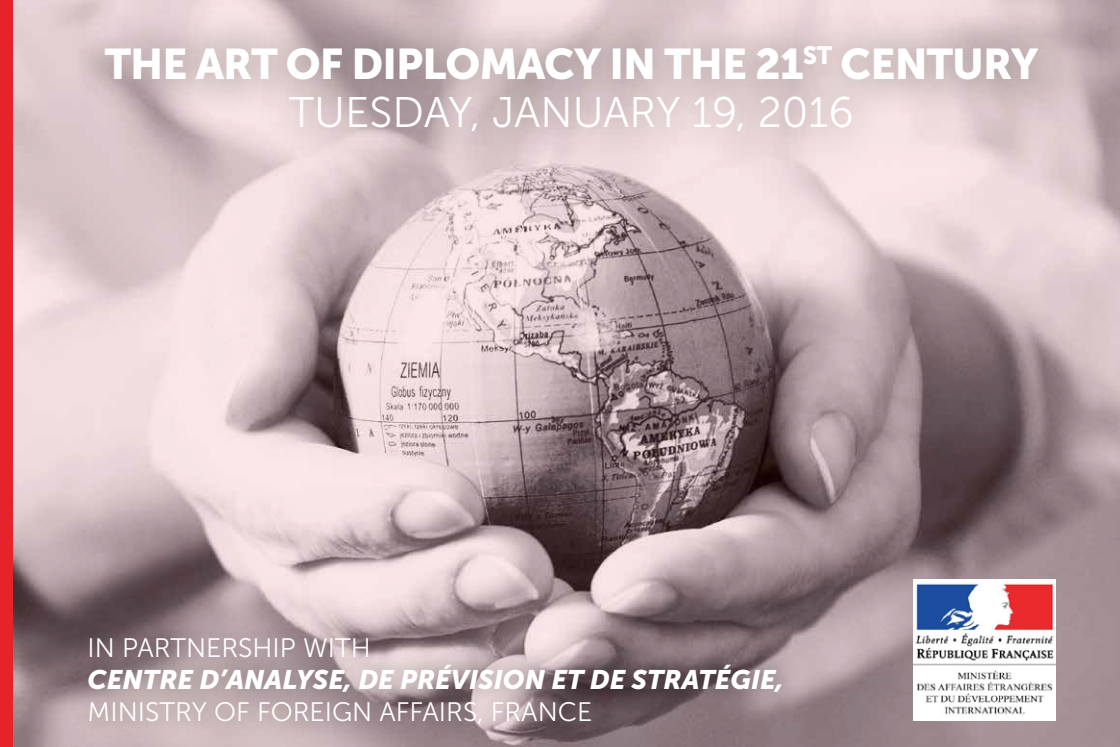

DIGITAL DIPLOMACY

All human activities have entered the digital age and diplomacy is no exception. This session will revolve around this transition and its manifold consequences, looking not only at the use diplomats make of digital technologies, but also the regulation of these technologies (ICANN, data protection, the application of national norms, etc.) – a question which has become more political than technical. The panel will also consider the new technological constraints the international system has to take into account (cyber espionage, Wikileaks and the Snowden case, etc.).
